Each spring, as we prepare for our AGM, the valley resonates with the welcome sound of hundreds of migratory birds. For me, it's an impetus to pay attention. It's a reminder that we humans are not the only species that need a healthy landscape, clean air, and clear, flowing water to thrive.

For Wildsight Invermere, 2022 was another fruitful year, thanks to community support. Our efforts continue to focus on three strategic areas: Community, Climate and Conservation. We carried out an ambitious program called Fire & Ice with ten events that investigated our changing landscape and how the climate emergency will further impact the Columbia Valley. These days, with the increasing stresses of wildfires, drought, and climate change, we know that we must pay even closer attention to our actions and the way we walk on this earth.

In 2022, the groundwork was laid for a multi-year program: the Columbia Lake Bighorn Sheep Biodiversity & Conservation Project. Besides gathering scientific data through regular monitoring, it's also a celebration of the unique beauty and diversity of our Columbia headwaters ecosystem. By fostering a sense of stewardship and shared responsibility, we can create a lasting impact on wildlife conservation.

As I step down from the Board of Directors after 11 years as its Chair, please be assured that I'm not going anywhere. I will remain engaged in Wildsight Invermere in many ways because I'm fully committed to protecting, nurturing and caring for this special place I call home.

Protect and conserve our local natural environment and species to ensure that thriving resilient ecosystems endure into the future

Old Growth Forests

In response to the concerns voiced by community members about the state of our forests and logging in old growth areas, we organized several meet ups. The aim was to foster dialogue, gather insights, and collectively work towards addressing the challenges faced by our forests and promoting their sustainable management.

Lake Enid Restoration

Lake Enid Restoration - To continue our conservation efforts we are partnering with Recreation Sites and Parks BC to construct fencing to protect an impacted section of the park. Due to technical issues, this will continue into 2023.

Wilmer Wetlands

We are proud of the success of the interpretive signs (installed in 2021). We are members of the Columbia Wetlands Stewardship Partners and work together to preserve the wetlands' biodiversity and natural balance.

Columbia Lake Bighorn Sheep Biodiversity & Conservation Project

Start of a multi-year project to ensure that this blue-listed species at risk has a chance to thrive. The project seeks to create a sense of unity and collaboration among community members as we embark on a collective effort to gather monitoring data that will enhance our understanding of these majestic creatures.

III. CLIMATE

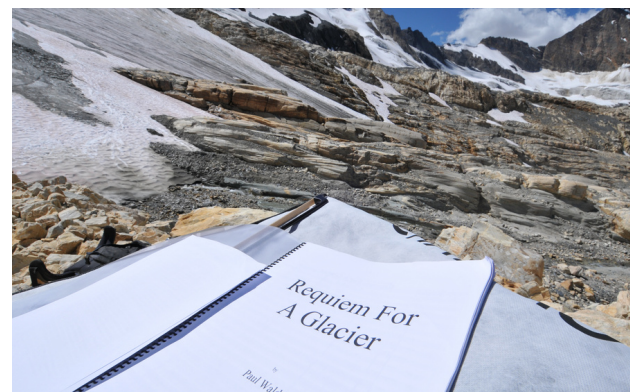
Raise awareness and engagement on climate change actions, informed by current science and based on best practices.

Fire & Ice

Fire & Ice was an interactive community engagement and education program featuring 10 events that explored how climate change is impacting our landscape, as well as its human and animal inhabitants. Designed to highlight two of the most visible and visceral consequences of climate change — forest fires and melting glaciers — the immersive events and activities demonstrated the importance of taking action to protect the wild spaces and species of our region.

EV Show

During our third annual electric vehicle show, a diverse range of EVs took the spotlight, including Wildsight's own innovation, Spark—the Electric Vehicle Car Share. This provided the 120 attendees with the unique opportunity to get acquainted with Spark and other EVs to learn more about owning and driving an electric car. 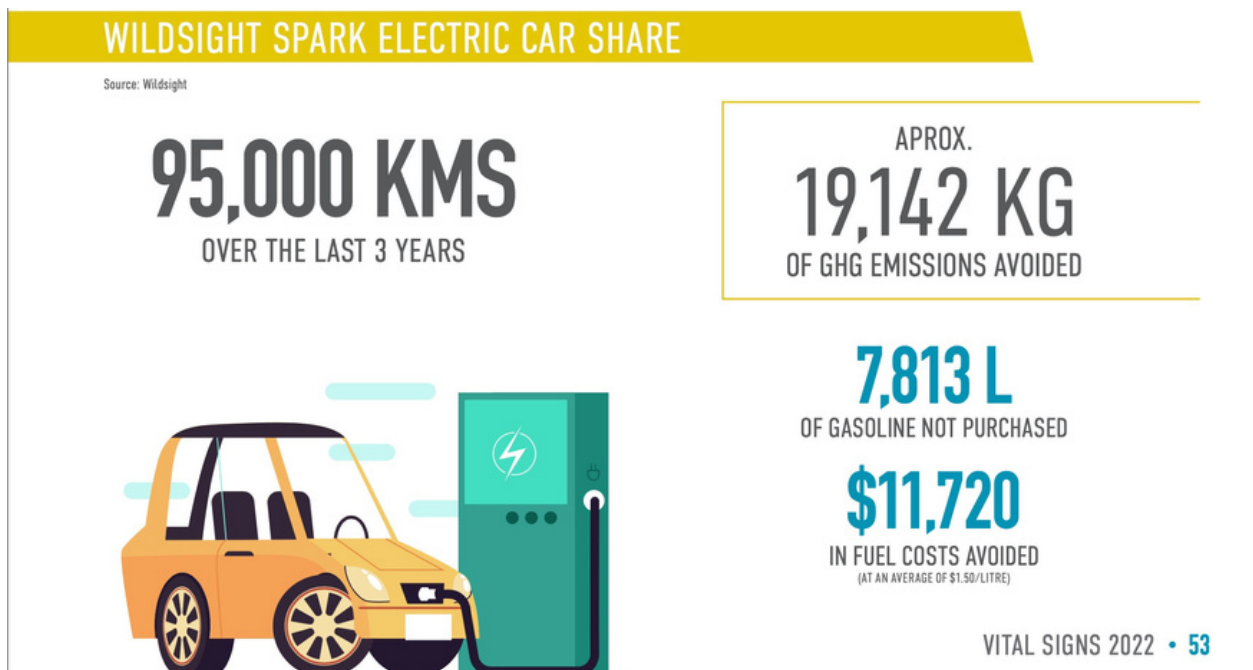


SPARK RURAL CANADA'S FIRST ALL-ELECTRIC VEHICLE SHARE

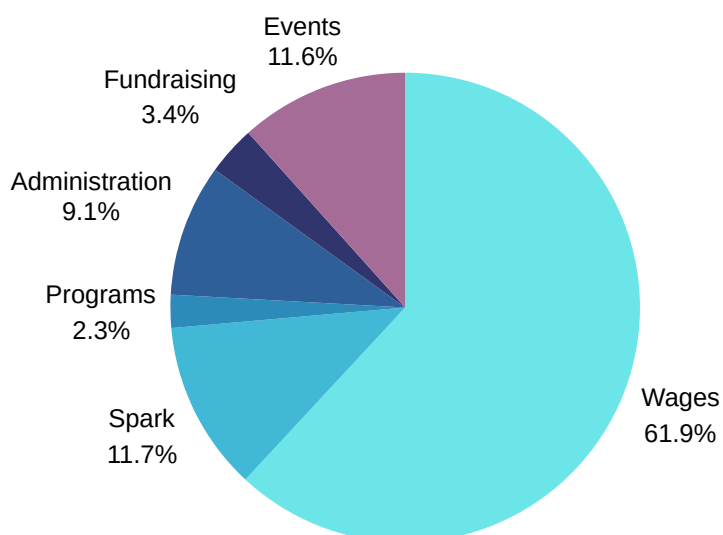

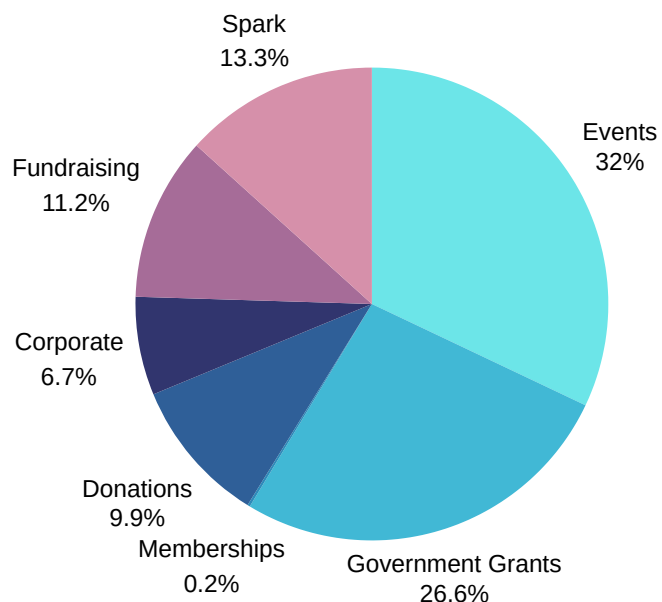
