

## FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

A 30th anniversary is a significant milestone for any grassroots environmental organization. For Wildsight Invermere, it reflects community support that endures through thick and thin. That's why in September, we celebrated with a potluck that brought together 60 people. It was a smorgasbord of friendship, goodwill and a shared vision of the preciousness of this valley, these mountains, and these wetlands.

For many years, issues like the Jumbo Glacier Resort proposal challenged our collective determination to protect wild places. It wore everyone down. It certainly caused divisiveness in Invermere. But in 2019, after almost 30 years, this saga concluded with a happy ending, thanks in no small part to the tenacity of the Jumbo Creek Conservation Society. The resort proposal was declared officially dead, and in early 2020, the Ktunaxa Nation, with the support of federal and provincial governments, announced the Qat'muk Indigenous Protected and Conserved Area. Our bumper stickers are now more meaningful than ever. Jumbo Valley Wild Forever is no longer a wish, but a statement and a reminder that engaged citizens can accomplish so much.

As always, our focus at Wildsight Invermere continues to evolve, directed by the passions of our Board and our members. Spark was born out of such passion. A committee of very dedicated and energetic "doers" turned a desire to build awareness around the viability of electric vehicles and to provide an accessible low-carbon transportation option for Columbia Valley residents into reality. In July, with the support of generous sponsors and funders, we bought a Chevy Bolt and our electric car share program was set in motion.

When philosopher/poet Ralph Waldo Emerson wrote, "The creation of a thousand forests is in one acorn," I think of our Wildsight community. Together, our actions can multiply into a vast ecosystem that thrives. And that makes me very happy.

## RURAL CANADA'S FIRST ELECTRIC VEHICLE SHARE

We began our Columbia Valley Electric Vehicle Share program in 2018 to provide a low-carbon transportation option in the Columbia Valley.

We spent much of 2019 actively building partnerships, securing program sponsors, and developing the software, hardware, and booking platform required to operate our fully electric vehicle share program.

Now a year in, the program has a new name-Spark-and we are pleased to report that through generous community support, we raised \$27,310 in sponsorship funds allowing us to purchase a brand new Chevy Bolt EV. We also obtained both a permanent parking stall and a dedicated charging station for the our EV-Keep an eye to the District of Invermere municipal office parking lot, and you might catch Sparky at home!

We are preparing to launch Spark publically in Spring 2020, when community members can then use the car hourly, daily, or longer, as available. In the interim, we continue to work on completing the booking platform and GoSpark.ca website.
