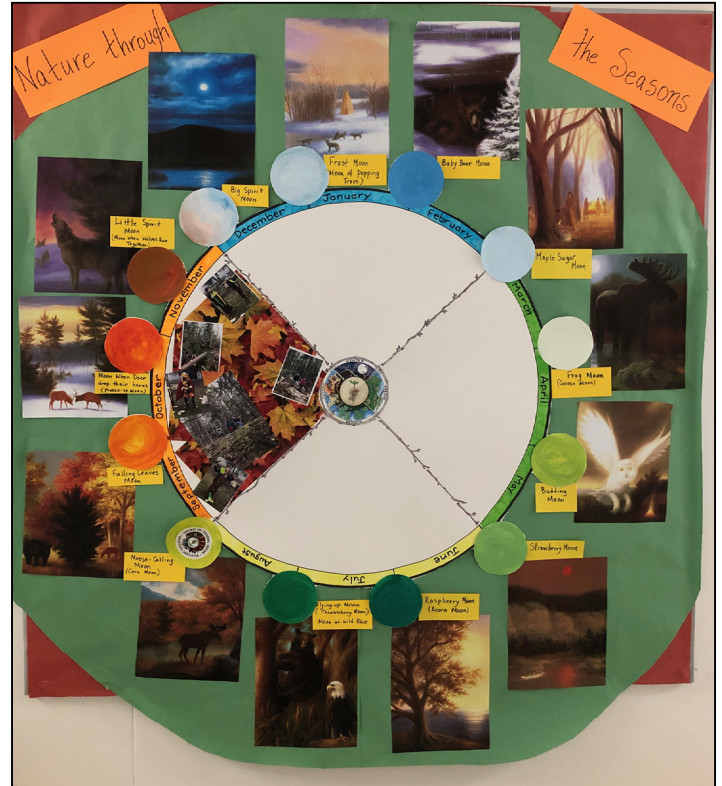


# Reflection and Extension
