

PLANT TYPE: TOMATO
VARIETY NAME: **Black Cherry**
LATIN NAME: *Lycopersicon lycopersicum*
POLLINATION: self
FLOWERS: complete, closed
ISOLATION: 5 m
POPULATION SIZE: minimum 6 plants



GROWING NOTES:

65 days, indeterminate — This tomato from Russia produces loads of 2.5 cm (1”) deep mahogany to brown fruits in an oval-to-round shape.

Sourced from Richters Herbs, live plant 2019 (These mail order seedlings barely survived).

GROWING NOTES:

65 days, indeterminate — very prolific - a healthy plant will produce many more than a hundred fruits. Very sweet.

GROWING NOTES:

80 days. This extremely old variety makes a vigorous plant that bears enormous numbers of bright yellow, bite-sized fruit. Very sweet, 1½-inch yellow, pear-shaped fruit has a mild flavor. Indeterminate.

This seed came from our seed swap; probably originated from a Prince George gardener; Mary has grown this variety since the late 90s.

GROWING NOTES:

65 days, indeterminate Plants bear heavy single to triple-stemmed fruit clusters. A unique and gorgeous pinkish-red colour, almost transparent. This very sweet variety was developed by Metchosin Farm on Vancouver Island.

GROWING NOTES:

75 dtm.

Bears clusters of 2-inch golden-yellow fruit. This variety is also a treat to eat, with deliciously sweet, juicy tomatoes that have a refreshing lemon-like finish to their flavor. Vigorous plants bear a great abundance of these very pretty golden fruits. Indeterminate.

GROWING NOTES:

72 days. Famously rich flavor and texture make this a colorful favorite among heirloom enthusiasts. Medium-large, flattened globe, 8-12 oz. fruits. Color is dusky pink with dark shoulders. Multilocular interior ranges from purple to brown to green. Relatively short vines.

Indeterminate.

GROWING NOTES:

Produces well in cold, wet climates or anywhere with a short growing season. This variety is resistant to Verticillium Wilt. Determinate.

The compact, tidy bush is resilient and will produce large quantities of medium large fruits with a mild, sweet flavour and remain nearly seedless until the end of summer.

GROWING NOTES:

Productive early heirloom Italian sauce tomato. 2-3 inch red fruit are plump and have a small point. Very good raw flavor compared to other paste tomatoes. A good variety for short season or cool summer locations. Can out-yield Roma, especially in cool summers. Good resistance to fusarium and no blossom end rot. Semi-determinate.

GROWING NOTES:

Roma tomatoes have a denser, drier flesh and few seeds, making them meaty, thick and ready to turn into a rich sauce. This variety freezes well, skins will slip off after thawing. Indeterminate.

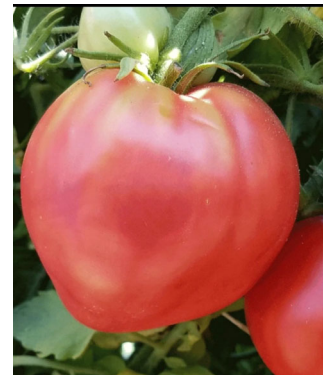


GROWING NOTES:

50 days, indeterminate — Pronounced "stu-peach-a," the potato-leaf, four foot tall plants are loaded with 2½-3 inch diameter, red fruits borne in clusters. Extremely early, great flavor. Heavy yields all season long and produces very well in northern climates.

A variety originating in the Czech Republic, introduced to North America in 1976. Plants are naturally disease resistant. *Sourced from Farm Folk City Folk's Citizen Seed Trials in 2019.*

GROWING NOTES:

80-90dtm.

An heirloom from the 1920s - this variety is from European seed. A heart shaped tomato that is pinkish red and very meaty with a mild sweet flavor. Fruit is huge, weighing 280-454 g (10oz-1 lb) each. Sizes can vary significantly but it is safe to say that they get very large and they are very prolific. Indeterminate.

This variety passed on to a Seed Library member (origin unknown).

LATIN NAME: *Lycopersicon lycopersicum*

GROWING NOTES:

80-90dtm.

An Italian heirloom, beefsteak tomato which produce large, meaty fruits on indeterminate vines. Staking is necessary.
