

# Using a key to identify a tree



This key will unlock the names of some native conifer trees in the Columbia Basin. First, find a conifer (a cone-bearing tree) and decide if its leaves are needles or scales. Then, by examining your tree, decide which arrows to follow to name that tree!

Tree has 'scales'

cones look like eggs

Western red cedar



cones look like berries

Rocky Mountain juniper



needles are SHARP, spiky and square

Engelmann spruce



needles not in bundles

needles are FLAT and friendly

needles are about the same length

Douglas fir



*My needles are not in bundles. See how each come out of the branch individually?*

needles are very different lengths

Western hemlock



Tree has needles

bundles of 2, 3 or 5 needles

bundles of 2

Lodgepole pine



bundles of 3

Ponderosa pine

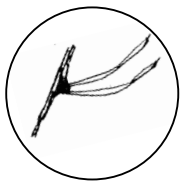


needles are in bundles
