"BURN IT SMART" PLEDGE

I/we _____ pledge to burn our new wood stove as cleanly as possible to minimise smoke emissions to protect the health of our family, our neighbours, and our community. If purchasing a heat pump, I pledge to only use my/our old wood stove when the power goes out or if/when the heat pump stops working efficiently in colder temperatures.

Burning wood more efficiently means complete combustion which should produce little to no smoke.

*Burning smart means always using dry firewood (<20% moisture), burning hot fires, never letting a fire smoulder and smoke, never burning garbage of any kind, and keeping the chimney clean.
This will save me money, increase the amount of heat produced per unit fuel, and decrease the risk of chimney fires - further protecting my family and property.*
